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RATIONALE

Art and design has the potential to empower young Zambians to become resourceful, self-reliant and economic participants in their communities. This programme begins by laying a firm foundation of generic skills, knowledge, values and attitudes that are useful to learners continuing with formal education or entering formal sector employment. It is also useful to the majority of school leavers who do not proceed with formal education or enter formal sector employment.

AIMS OF Grades 8 and 9 - Junior Secondary School Education Level

On completion of junior secondary, the learners should:

- 1. Develop an understanding of life skills through Art and Design
- 2. Acquire an appreciation and maintenance of traditional Art and Crafts of the Zambian Society
- 3. Acquire power of imagination and critical observation.
- 4. Develop an understanding and appreciation of the nature
- 5. Demonstrate the acquisition of the following skills;
 - 5.1 manipulation
 - 5.2 co-ordination
 - 5.3 correlation
 - 5.4 self expression
- 6. Achieve a level of practical skill necessary for further technical and vocational training
- 7. Master correct working habits (such as Concentration and perseverance and safety procedures.)
- 8. Recognize modern materials, working procedures and technology
- 9. Develop an understanding of entrepreneurship

SUGGESTED TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Learner-centred teaching focuses on learners, who play a centre role in teaching and learning activities. It gives them opportunity to participate actively and independently in their learning. With the help of the teacher, they are encouraged to seek an understanding of art activities. A teacher acts as a facilitator to be built on the learner's existing knowledge, skills, values, attitudes and experiences. These experiences should be stimulating for effective learning.
